NHa & AT have met with Cait Barratt and her team and have clarified that within the grant there's an expectation that they support the Friends with volunteer support. It has been agreed that there will be an annual volunteer event and the creation of a volunteering opportunities guide, an online volunteering calendar and also the opportunity for guided walk training and resources for walk leaders. The creation of a research agenda for the Stockton & Darlington Railway and early railways was highlighted as a potential item to develop. A meeting has been held of the education committee and it's been Locomotion No. 1 replica has been condemned and permission has been given to SBC to dispose.
