The next walk booklet revision

The walk booklet between Shildon and Heighington was officially launched at Locomotion on the 27th September. They are also providing two specially designed robotic lawnmowers (with a plugwheel inspired design and The Friends of the Stockton & Darlington Railway written on them) which we can raffle to raise funds. S&DR competitions

I'd like to remind you of two competitions that we are supporting.

- 1. Write on Track is the creative writing workshop. We're looking for poetry, short stories and memoir pieces related in some way to trains and railways. These don't need to be specifically about the Stockton & Darlington Railway we just want to see a clear link to railways, tracks and trains within the work. - 2. The SDR200 Research on the Rails competition is being organised by the Cleveland and Teesside Local History Society and the Friends of the Stockton & Darlington Railway for original research into the S&DR. The best entries will be published in their journals (The Globe and Cleveland History), or we may decide to publish a separate new, joint publication. The original research can be on any subject connected to the history of the Stockton & Darlington Railway up to 1863, including its impact beyond that date. It can be about people, technology, events, archival research, impacts the choice is yours. There are more details being circulated with these papers.

The prize will be up to £1,000, provided jointly by Cleveland & Teesside Local History Society and The Friends of the Stockton & Darlington Railway and awarded to the author(s) of an essay which fulfils the criteria of the competition and which in the opinion of the judges merits the award.

Guided walks training

We are holding our training for walk leaders at Locomotion on the 14th October at Locomotion 10am-1pm. If you intend leading any walks, or acting as rear guard, then you need to be on this course. We are almost at capacity, but can probably squeeze in a couple more.

IMechE

The Institution of mechanical Engineering has awarded the S&DR an award for engineering innovation. George Stephenson was its first president. We have been looking at the location and number of plaques to be positioned along the line, and the wording on the plaques. This is surprisingly challenging!

Correspondence

As 2025 approaches, we are becoming very popular! We are receiving about 2-3 requests a week to give talks next year (all over the UK) and diaries are filling up for the rest of 2024 (another request has just come in as I write this!). My best job in relation to this in the last month was to judge a poetry competition on railways by the Durham County Federation of Women's Institutes. We are also receiving a wide variety of queries via the web site ranging from requests for images, advice on content, advice on copyright, specialist advice for funded projects and approaches for joint Fringe events in 2025. Amongst the latter I have met with Stockton Libraries (with Barry Thompson) to discuss options which unsurprisingly featured books, walks, film, music, and beer.

Early Railways Conference Darlington 22nd-26th September 2025

Niall and I have been working on the synopses of two papers being given at next year's conference. One on the development of the railway station on the S&DR to be given jointly with Eric Branse-Instone of Historic England and the other a keynote address on the S&DR.
